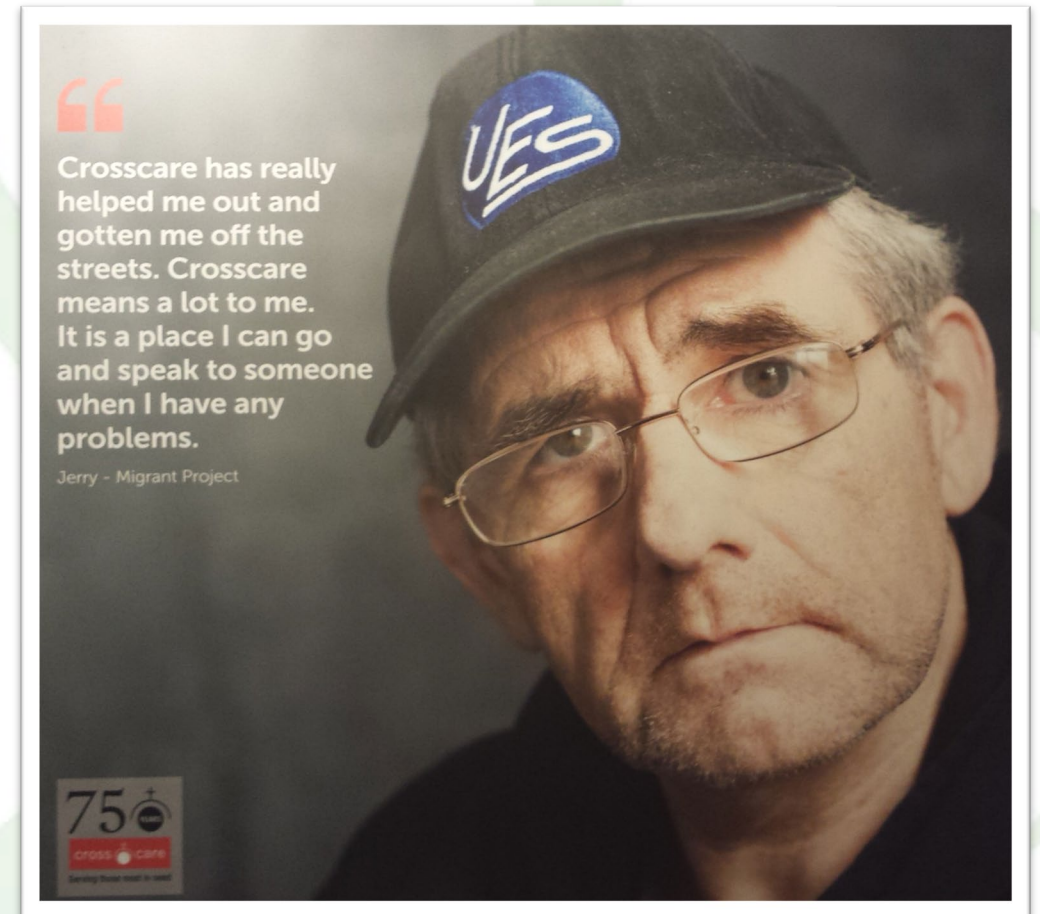

Who we are and what we do

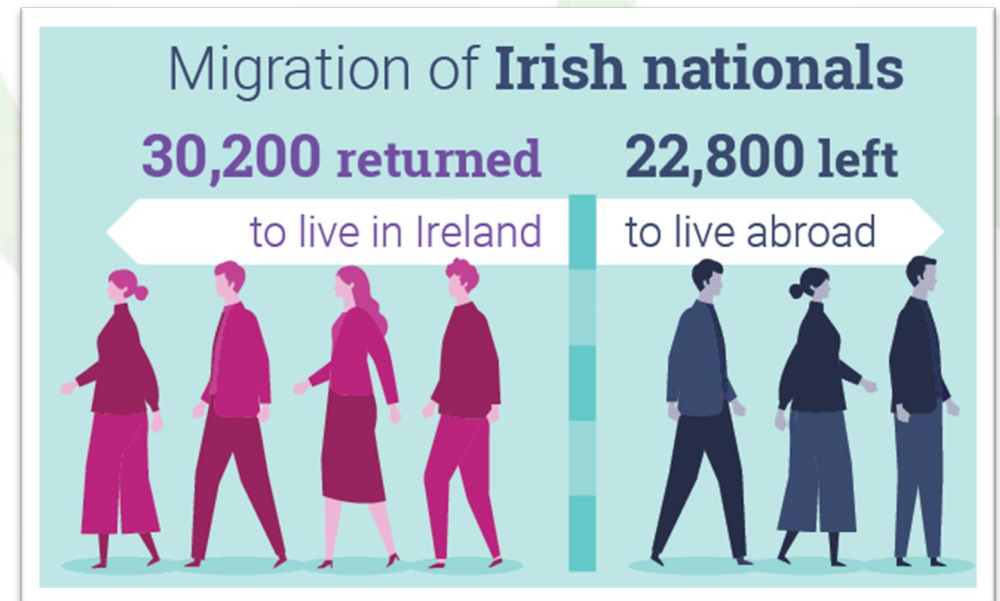
Crosscare Migrant Project

- Dublin based NGO funded by Irish Government's Emigrant Support Programme
- Established in 1987 as 'Emigrant Advice'
- Project of Crosscare, large social care service provider in the Dublin region
- Provide information, advocacy and referral supports to Irish emigrants and returning emigrants, particularly people in vulnerable situations
- Collaborate with and offer capacity building training to Irish emigrant groups abroad
- Research trends in Irish migration
- Undertake social policy campaigns



Trends in Irish return migration

- More people returning than emigrating
- Some reasons for return:
 - Covid-19 pandemic
 - Employment opportunities in various sectors
 - Want to be closer to family
- Things to consider:
 - Plan and do your research
 - Do what you can beforehand
 - Have savings and budget
 - Do what's right for you and have realistic expectations
 - Remember it will take time to get set up on return
 - Give yourself time to adjust and reach out for support
- *'Talk to others who have done it, but mostly take your time with the decision and think about why you are doing it'* – returnee from Australia

Immigration process for spouses and civil partners

- Visa v non-visa required
- Preparation
 - Proof of relationship
 - Financial criteria
- Dealing with Immigration at Border Control in Ireland
- Registering for residency permission
 - In Dublin
 - Outside Dublin

Pre-clearance process for de facto partners

- Key criteria in order to be eligible to apply
 - 2 years co-habitation minimum
 - Proof of relationship
 - Proof of finances
- Pre-clearance process for everyone (visa and non-visa required)
- Applying online
- Processing times
- If application is granted or refused
- Dealing with Immigration at Border Control in Ireland
- Registering for residency permission
 - In Dublin
 - Outside Dublin

Alternatives routes and other family members

- Alternatives
 - Working holiday
 - Work permit
 - Study
- Other family members
 - Children
 - Adult dependents
